


### To assemble the monitor:




- While assembling the monitor arm/base, we recommend that you keep the monitor inside its EPS (Carton box) packaging.
- 1. Take out all accessory from the upside EPS.




2. Take out upside EPS from carton box and then push open stand assembly hole.




- Align the screw hole on the monitor with the bundled screw on the arm. Then insert the arm into the monitor.

4. Fix the base to the arm by fastening the bundled screw.




 Remove the monitor from its EPS packaging. Adjust the monitor to the angle that is most comfortable for you.



• This is a shortcut key. Default setting is GameVisual.


# 5. GamePlus Button:

- This is a shortcut key. Default setting is GamePlus.
- GamePlus: The GamePlus Function provides a toolkit and creates a better gaming environment for users when playing different types of games. Particularly, Crosshair function is specially designed for new gamers or beginners interested in First Person Shooter (FPS) games.

To active GamePlus:

- Press GamePlus Button to enter the GamePlus main menu.
- Activate Crosshair, Timer, FPS Counter or Display Alignment function.

- Move the button up/down to select and press to confirm the function needed. Press to go off, and exit.
- Crosshair/Timer/FPS Counter is movable by pressing 5-way key.



# 2.1 Adjusting the monitor

- For optimal viewing, we recommend that you look at the full face of the monitor, then adjust the monitor to the angle that is most comfortable for you.
- Hold the stand to prevent the monitor from falling when you change its angle.
- You can adjust the monitor's angle from -5° to 20° and it allows 16° swivel adjustment from either left or right. You can also adjust the monitor's height within +/- 12 cm.






It is normal that the monitor slightly shakes while you adjust the viewing angle.

# 2.3 Detaching the arm/stand (for VESA wall mount)




 Avoid damaging the monitor surface. While detaching the monitor stand, always keep the monitor inside its EPS packaging.

The detachable stand of this monitor is specially designed for VESA wall mount.

#### To detach the arm/stand

- Disconnect power and signal cables. Carefully put the monitor facedown on its EPS packaging.
- 2. Remove the covers on where the monitor and the arm meet.
- Remove the four (4) screws securing the arm to the rear of the monitor.
- 4. Detach the stand (arm and base) from the monitor.






 Use only the UL Listed Wall Mount Bracket with minimum weight/load 28.8 kg (Screw size: M4 x 10 mm).

# 3.1 OSD (On-Screen Display) menu

### 3.1.1 How to reconfigure



- 1. Press the Central of 5-way button to display the OSD menu.
- Press the Up and Down keys to switch the options in the menu.
   When you move from one icon to another, the option name is highlighted.
- To select a highlighted item from the menu, press the Right key or the Central button.
- 4. Press the Up and Down keys to select the desired parameters.
- Press the Right key or the Central button to enter the slide bar, and then use the Up or Down keys (depending on the indicators in the menu) to make changes.





- Color Temp.: Contains three preset color modes (Cool, Normal, Warm) and User Mode.
- Gamma: Contains three gamma modes including 1.8, 2.2, 2.5.



In the User Mode, colors of R (Red), G (Green), and B (Blue) are user-configurable; the adjusting range is from 0 ~ 100.

  FreeSync support 48-100Hz under HDMI mode. FreeSync
  support 48-144Hz under DP mode.
- Blue Light Filter: Adjust the energy level of blue light emitted from LED backlight.
- HDR: High Dynamic Range. Contains three HDR modes (ASUS Cinema HDR, ASUS Gaming HDR and FreeSync2 HDR).
   HDR item will be locked when connected to AMD FreeSync2 HDR video. (FreeSync2 HDR non-support under HDMI@120Hz)
- Shadow Boost: Dark color enhancement adjust monitor gamma curve to enrich the dark tones in an image making dark scenes and objects much easier be found.



 Choose 4:3 to display the picture according to the original aspect ratio of the input source.



- When Blue Light Filter is activated, the default settings of Racing Mode will be automatically imported.
- Between Level 1 to Level 3, the Brightness function is userconfigurable.
- Level 4 is optimized setting. It is compliance with TUV Low Blue Light Certification. The Brightness function is not userconfigurable.




Please refer to the following to alleviate eye strains:

- Users should take some time away from the display if working for long hours. It is advised to take short breaks (at least 5 mins) after around 1 hour of continuous working at the computer. Taking short and frequent breaks is more effective than a single longer break.

- **PBP Source**: Selects the video input source among, "HDMI-1", "HDMI-2" or "DisplayPort".
- Color setting: Set GameVisual mode for each PBP window.






